<u>DISCIPLINARY ORDER REPRIMANDING</u> A DEALER AND REPRIMANDING AND FINING AN AGENT

Be it remembered that K. W. Chambers & Co. ("Respondent Chambers"), by and through its president, Kenneth Wayne Chambers; and James Ronald Sanford ("Respondent Sanford"), individually; appeared before the Securities Commissioner of the State of Texas ("Securities Commissioner") and consented to the entry of this Order and, without admitting or denying the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law contained herein, except Findings of Fact one through three which are admitted.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondents have waived (a) Respondents' right to notice and hearing in this matter; (b) Respondents' right to appear and present evidence in this matter; (c) Respondents' right to appeal this Order; and (d) all other procedural rights granted to Respondents by The Securities Act, TEX. REV. CIV. STAT. ANN. art. 581-1 et seq. (Vernon 1964 & Supp.2000) ("Texas Securities Act"), and the Administrative Procedure Act, TEX. GOV'T CODE ANN. §2001 .001 et sea. (Vernon Supp. 2000) ("Administrative Procedure Act").

- 2. Respondent Chambers is registered with the Securities Commissioner as a dealer.
- 3. Respondents Sanford has filed an application with the Securities Commissioner to be registered as an agent of Respondent Chambers.
- 4. The State Securities Board has received a complaint from a Texas resident regarding an account at Respondent Chambers.
- 5. Respondent Sanford acted as an agent of Respondent Chambers for this account at times when he was not properly registered with the Securities Commissioner as required by Section 12 of the Texas Securities Act.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- The foregoing violations constitute bases for the issuance of an order reprimanding a dealer and agent of a dealer pursuant to Section 14.A(6) of the Texas Securities Act.
- 2. The foregoing violations constitute bases for the issuance of an order assessing administrative fines pursuant to Section 23-1 of the Texas Securities Act.

ORDER

- 1. It is therefore ORDERED that Respondents Chambers and Sanford are hereby REPRIMANDED.
- 2. It is further ORDERED that the registration of James Ronald Sanford is hereby GRANTED.
- 3. It is further ORDERED that Respondent Chambers is hereby ASSESSED AN ADMINISTRATIVE FINE in the amount of Five Hundred Dollars (\$ 500.00). Payment shall be made by delivery of a cashier's check to the Securities Commissioner in the amount of Five Hundred Dollars (\$ 500.00), payable to the State of Texas, contemporaneously with the delivery of this Order.
- 4. It is further ORDERED that Respondent Sanford is hereby ASSESSED AN ADMINISTRATIVE FINE in the amount of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00). Payment shall be made by delivery of a cashier's check to the Securities Commissioner in the amount of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), payable to the State of Texas, contemporaneously with the delivery of this Order.
