DISCIPLINARY ORDER

Be it remembered that Grace Temple Barnard ("Respondent") appeared before the Securities Commissioner of the State of Texas ("Securities Commissioner") and consented to the entry of this order ("Order") and the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law contained herein.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondent has waived (a) Respondent's right to notice and hearing in this matter; (b) Respondent's right to appear and present evidence in this matter; (c) Respondent's right to appeal this Order; and (d) all other procedural rights granted to Respondent by The Securities Act, TEX. REV. CIV. STAT. ANN. art. 581-1 et seq. (Vernon 1964 & Supp. 2004-2005) ("Texas Securities Act"), and the Administrative Procedure Act, TEX. GOV'T CODE ANN. § 2001.001 et seq. (Vernon 2000 & Supp. 2004-2005) ("Administrative Procedure Act").
2. On or about September 14, 2001, Respondent registered with the Securities Commissioner as an agent of New Investor World Incorporated ("NIW"), which is currently effective.
3. On or about April 24, 1996, a judgment (the "Judgment"), in the amount of \$24,627, was entered against Respondent. As of the date of this Order, Respondent has not satisfied the Judgment.

4. On or about January 12, 2001, and pursuant to Section 115.2 of the Rules and Regulations of the Texas State Securities Board ("Board Rules"), Respondent filed a Uniform Application for Securities Industry Registration or Transfer ("Form U-4") with the Securities Commissioner to become registered as an agent of NIW.
5. Pursuant to Sections 101.2(c) and 133.33(a) of the Board Rules, certain forms required to be filed with the Securities Commissioner, including the Form U-4, have been adopted as Board Rules and have the same force and effect.
6. The Form U-4 filed by Respondent required the disclosure of any unsatisfied judgments against Respondent. However, Respondent denied the existence of any unsatisfied judgments on the Form U-4 and thereby failed to disclose the existence of the Judgment.
7. The information requested on the Form U-4 is deemed necessary by the Securities Commissioner to determine an agent's business repute or qualifications.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW


1. Respondent's failure to disclose the Judgment as an unsatisfied judgment constitutes a violation of the Form U-4, a Board Rule.
2. Respondent's denial of the existence of any unsatisfied judgments against Respondent constitutes a material misrepresentation to the Securities Commissioner in connection with information deemed necessary by the Securities Commissioner to determine an agent's business repute or qualifications.
3. Pursuant to Sections 14.A(6) and 14.A(7) of the Texas Securities Act, the foregoing violations constitute bases for the issuance of an order reprimanding an agent.
4. Pursuant to Section 23-1 of the Texas Securities Act, the foregoing violation of a Board Rule constitutes the basis for the assessment of an administrative fine against Respondent pursuant to Section 23-1 of the Texas Securities Act.

ORDER

1. It is therefore ORDERED that Grace Temple Barnard is hereby REPRIMANDED.
2. It is further ORDERED that Grace Temple Barnard is hereby ASSESSED AN ADMINISTRATIVE FINE in the amount of Two Thousand and Five Hundred Dollars

(\$2,500.00). Payment shall be made by delivery of a cashier's check to the Securities Commissioner in the amount of Two Thousand and Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00), payable to the State of Texas, contemporaneously with the delivery of this Order.




